



THE HISTORIC MARKER PROGRAM recognizes structures of historic and architectural significance in Rockbridge County, Virginia. By identifying such structures, Historic Lexington Foundation strives to foster broader public awareness and appreciation for the area's past and encourage efforts to preserve its architectural heritage.

What buildings are eligible?

The county is architecturally rich. Buildings have often undergone various uses over the years. Building types covered by the marker program include those that over their lifetimes have served as private residences, commercial buildings, stables, mills, theaters, schools, churches, and municipal buildings.

Generally, a building must be at least 50 years old and of historic and/or architectural significance in Lexington, Buena Vista, or Rockbridge County. The building's exterior must be properly maintained in accordance with its architectural style and heritage. Changes and alterations to the building's exterior must be consistent with its architectural integrity. If a building has been moved from its original site, it must maintain its historic architectural style.

What does my historic marker look like?

The marker is an attractive 10 in. x 7 in. bronze oval, with deep green background and polished bronze lettering. The all-weather marker is designed for placement on the outside of your structure. Each custom-made marker shows the historic name of the building and the date the structure was built. The marker also carries the name and logo of HLF.

What does my historic marker cost?

Once an application has been approved, HLF will request \$200 from the applicant. This covers the cost of fabricating the marker and shipping and handling. Should the cost of the marker increase in the future, the cost to the applicant will increase accordingly.

How should I install my historic marker?

Installation will be at the owner's expense. It is expected that the marker will be installed on the front of the property. If the applicant requires professional assistance in installing the marker, HLF will provide recommendations for such service.

How long does it take to produce my marker?

Your marker will be ready in approximately 8 weeks and will be shipped to a street address you provide.
